

You have been soldiering through a cold January, combating the frosty mornings and dark evenings outside.

In January The Donhead Apple Company held its annual wassail on the weekend closest to the old Twelfth Night. Those wassailers who were fortunate to attend, gathered in the Village Hall before proceeding down to the orchard. There the Orchard Green Man was waiting, and together with the Wassail princesses they offered one of the trees toast and cider. With much shouting and banging of pots and pans the villagers banished the evil spirits away for the forthcoming season.

February has followed, the days becoming slightly lighter and the sight of welcoming white snowdrops and now daffodils adorning roadsides and thickets... suddenly February looks better.

Then in a flash March has arrived...welcome to spring...everywhere you look, nature is busy getting dressed...green, yellow, orange, white, fresh and bright, big and bold with fuzzy buds and blousy blooms. It may still be cold, damp and wet but there are lots of jobs for us busy gardeners to do to prepare for a vintage year ahead. Plant summer bulbs, prune roses, keep slugs away from those delicate green shoots, plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes...whatever you do, enjoy it.

Our January meeting brought Adam Wallis from Brimsmore Gardens who gave us a wonderful demonstration and talk on propagation. This covered many topics from seeds and the taking of softwood and hardwood cuttings, through to specialist ways of propagating some of the more difficult species such as a Daphne shrub for example. For this Adam demonstrated the technique of Air Layering, which involved creating a moss filled, cellophane wrapped bubble around a cut in a stem. This was an art form in itself, and the whole talk was very professionally delivered by Adam who took many questions from members at the end.

To help us prepare the ground for our garden in February, Lois Phillips came along to talk and show us how to look after and love our soil. With the chance to check our own samples of soil brought along to test. This was an informative and enjoyable evening for many enjoying the hands on testing.

#### Future Talks:

Monday 13th March, our next meeting the AGM is upon us once again. Please do support this necessary requirement of the Club's Constitution. With the success and positive feedback from last year's AGM, we shall again be sending out the Agenda, Minutes and all other relevant papers to you by email.
